Interests for Universities

- Access to data
- Funding
- Internships, job opportunities for students
- Image
- Motivation



Interests for Sports Organisations

- Source of knowledge, information, ideas
- Alternative to consultancy services
- Source of trained workforce
- Continuing education for staff
- Access to new networks
- Sharing a vision with future decision-makers
- Social Responsibility



2. Why are such collaborations still seen as unusual?



Sources of Misunderstanding

- Incompatibility of speed
- Lack of mutual understanding, divergent interests
- Absence of platforms



3. Proposals to foster collaboration



- Need for evaluating the quality of existing programmes in sport management (ranking, certification)
- Need for continuing education programmes
- Need for doctoral programmes in Europe
- Involvement of practitioners on the boards of the programmes

- Current knowledge in sport management?
Need for meta-analysis and a practitioner's handbook
- Define an agenda for the research in sport management in collaboration with sports organisations
- Launch a research-based, practice-oriented journal specialised in sport management



Role for EASM?

- Encourage attendance of practitioners
- Involvement of practitioners in EASM Board
- Discuss the collective research agenda
- Certification of programmes in sport management
